Statement of Results

All results on your statement that will be given to you on results day are provisional (pending any post-results services outcomes that you may or may not apply for) until you receive your certificates in November.

Grades

All GCSEs are now graded 9 – 1, with 9 being the highest grade. A Levels are graded A^* – E, with A^* being the highest grade.

Grade Boundaries

All exam boards set grade boundaries. Grade boundaries are the minimum mark needed to achieve a certain grade. They are set after the exams have taken place and all the marking is complete.

What if I am unhappy with my results?

In the first instance, you would need to speak to your subject teacher or the exams officer, Miss Pettifer who will be able to decide what the next step is.

How can we help?

- We could request a copy of your exam script. We could also apply for a review of marking on your behalf. We would need your written permission to do either of these.
- A review of marking can only be requested by the school and not by students or parents/carers.
- There may be a charge for a review of marking, unless otherwise stated by Miss Pettifer.

Deadlines for Post Results Services:

*Priority Review of Marking – Tuesday 20th August

*Priority Access to Scripts – Tuesday 27th August

*(Priority Review of Marking & Access to Scripts can only be requested for students whose grade is dependent on a university placement).

Review of Marking – Friday 20th September

Access to Scripts – Friday 20th September

It is important to remember that a review of marking can result in your grade going up, down or remaining the same.

University Applications

If you have applied to university through UCAS, the exam board will automatically send your provisional results to UCAS, who will forward them on to your chosen university. If you have requested any post-results services and your grades change, the exam board will send the new grade to UCAS the day after your amended grade has been made available to the school.

Certificates

Your certificates will be sent to the school by Thursday 7th November, and this will show your final confirmed results. We will send an email and update our website and social media sites confirming when they are available and ready to collect. Please do not arrive at school without making an appointment to collect them as they may not be ready, and you will be turned away.

Remember, your certificate is an important document that you will need to keep in a safe place and will most likely be asked for them by future employers. If you lose your certificate, you will need to contact the exam boards yourself and you will be charged.
