Method of Assessment

3 exams at the end of the second year

Research Methods (01)* - 90 marks written paper, 2 hours, 30% of total A level.

Psychological Themes through core studies (02)* - 105 marks written Paper, 2 hours, 35% of total A level


Applied Psychology (03) - 105 marks written paper, 2 hours, 35% of total A level
